Once the report is submitted, it will be reviewed to make sure it meets the criteria for online submission. If so, the person reporting the incident will receive a case number via email. If the incident does not meet the criteria for online submission, the person reporting the incident will be directed to call 911 for a response from law enforcement.



Online Crime Reporting

The Snohomish Police Department is pleased to announce a new citizen crime reporting tool to meet the needs of a busy society. On September 15, 2014, MyCrimeReport.us was brought online as a free crime reporting website for certain non-emergencies. This new tool will allow a resident of Snohomish County an accurate, fast, and convenient way to report certain types of crime using the internet or a smart mobile device. This tool is designed for the person who is reporting a theft, vehicle prowl, hit and run of an unattended vehicle, malicious mischief, or lost property in which the dollar amount of loss or damage is \$5,000 or less. Additionally, this tool is only for crimes where there is no suspect or witness information, and the crime scene lacks any physical evidence. The website for this new tool is: www.MyCrimeReport.us

This new tool is being introduced in response to requests from the public for a more convenient way to report being the victim of a crime without having to wait around for a police officer to respond. This tool may also be used to report criminal activity observed by the public. The provided information will be processed by police department staff and given to an on-duty patrol supervisor for further action.

There are a few ways to get started using this new tool. The first, and perhaps most common way, is someone calling 911 for assistance will be screened by the call taker to determine if MyCrime Report is an appropriate way to proceed. If the circumstances surrounding the call to 911 fall into the earlier description, the caller to 911 will be directed to www.MyCrimeReport.us and to then follow the directions. The next way to access this new service is for someone to go directly to



DEA National Prescription Drug Take-Back September 27, 2014 – 8 AM – 12 PM

The National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day aims to provide a safe, secure, and environmentally responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse and trafficking of medications. This is important because the non-medical use of controlled substance (CS) medications is at an all-time high, with 6.8 million Americans reporting having abused prescription drugs in 2012, according to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH) released in 2013. That same study revealed more than 54 percent of people who abuse prescription pain relievers got them through friends or relatives, a statistic that includes raiding the family medicine cabinet.

Take-Back Days are presently needed because the Controlled Substances Act (CSA) as originally written did not provide a way for patients, caregivers, and pet owners to dispose of such CS medications as painkillers, sedatives, and stimulants like ADHD drugs. People were flushing their old meds down the toilet or throwing them in the trash.

The Snohomish Police Department will once again be participating in the DEA National Prescription Drug Take-Back event on **Saturday, September 27, 2014**. Residents of the City of Snohomish, and the surrounding community, are welcome to come by the police department between **8 AM and 12 Noon** to drop off any unwanted prescription drugs. In addition to this special event, residents of the Snohomish area are able to stop by the Snohomish Police Department Monday through Friday between the hours of 9 AM and 5 PM to drop off any unwanted prescription drugs all year long.

Chief John Flood reports that the Snohomish Police Department has offered this free service since 2010

with the following amounts of unwanted prescription drugs properly removed from the Snohomish community:

2010	174 pounds
2011	185 pounds
2012	272 pounds
2013	286 pounds
2014	247 pounds as of September 17, 2014.

The following items are accepted:

- EpiPens (Unopened)
- Inhalers, Medicated ointments / lotions (prescription and over-the-counter)
- Medication samples
- Medications for pets, Narcotics (OxyContin, Vicodin, etc.)
- Over-the-counter medication
- Prescribed medication
- Vitamins

The following items are not accepted:

- Aerosol cans
- Business waste (For more information, visit Dept. of Ecology)
- Empty containers
- EpiPens - Used (For more information, visit Take Back Your Meds)
- Hydrogen peroxide / other chemicals
- Iodine solutions (Betadine, etc.)
- IV bags or bloody / infectious waste
- Mercury products (Mercurochrome, thimerosal, etc.)
- Needles / syringes
- Personal care products (Toothpaste, non-medicated shampoo, medical items, etc.)
- Radioactive materials
- Thermometers

Applicants Sought for Snohomish Design Review Board

Applicants are being sought to fill a current vacancy on the City of Snohomish Design Review Board. Applications are due to the City Clerk by 4:00 p.m. on Friday, September 26, at City Hall, 116 Union Avenue in Snohomish.

The Design Review Board member term runs for four years. The Board considers and reviews rehabilitation and restoration of historic structures to encourage better design and site planning. The City's Historic District represents an economic and cultural asset to the City and design review helps preserve this asset by keeping its character intact.

Applicants to the Design Review Board should be knowledgeable in matters of design and aesthetic judgment by virtue of training, education, and/or experience, and should possess qualities of impartiality and broad judgment, and an ability to review two-dimensional plans. Desired qualifications for Board members include an expertise in the fields of architecture, history, building trades, landscape architecture, graphic, interior, and industrial design, and/or land development.

Eligible applicants are those with an interest in the City as a result of either living, working, owning property or business in the City, and/or belonging to one of the City's civic organizations. All City board and commission members are volunteers serving without compensation.

The Planning Commission considers land use, regional and comprehensive plan issues, and makes recommendations to the City Council. The Planning Commission may recommend moratoria and/or interim land use controls and hold public hearings as deemed necessary by the City Council.

Planning Commission members are appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation by the City Council. Commission members must live within the City's urban growth boundary. All City board and commission members are volunteers serving without compensation. Planning Commission terms run for six years.
