It was suggested to bring the map to NNO, have discussions with participants, and promote neighborhoods meeting to pick their name.

Commissioner Strom inquired about gathering names. Councilmember Ray responded she had names and information gathered from previous events, but the Commission would need to decide what to do with them. She suggested contacting Everett's Office of Neighborhoods and see how they do it.

Commissioner Messinger asked the Commission to draw where each member lives and identify their neighborhood.

Commissioner Brovan moved to have Commissioner Messinger be the representative for Neighborhood Watch, seconded by Commissioner Mills. Motion passed 5-0 (Messinger abstained).

7. **STAFF MANAGER UPDATE.** Ms. Ireton will meet with Chief Palmer monthly, and hopes to add meetings with the Fire District. The City was hiring a Community Outreach Specialist, who would work directly with the Commission.
8. **COUNCIL LIAISON UPDATES.** None.
9. **COMMISSION MEMBER UPDATES:** Commissioner Mills reported working on Citizen Corps, which ties together CERT, Police, Fire, and Map Your Neighborhood, referring to Skagit County as a model. He asked when the Commission could have a town hall or event to promote engagement and input, safety, etc. It was suggested maybe in the fall after school started.

Councilmember Brovan reiterated the importance of contacting houses of faith.

10. **OTHER BUSINESS/INFORMATION ITEMS:** Ms. Ireton and Sgt. Veentjer discussed SMART 911. Commissioner Clark Fulmer would follow up with the Department of Emergency Management (DEM) and Sno911. Commissioner Brovan will attend NNO to discuss the Neighborhood Watch program, and display the map previously discussed.
