Request for Proposals Posted

The City has posted two new Request for Proposals. One is for a communications specialist and the other is for an economic development specialist. These opportunities are to fill the vacancy created upon the appointment of Debbie Emge to Finance Director in December 2016. The City is seeking contract positions at this time in lieu of regular staff positions, in order to maintain flexibility during the transition time to the Mayor-Council form of government, which will officially occur in November 2017.
