"It has been amazing to hear all the stories that customers have about The Oxford when they came in to pick up their to-go orders, or as they were walking down the street stopping in to give words of encouragement. I've heard these feelings over and over again. The acknowledgment and gratitude from business owners and merchants who recognize that they were able to stay in operation because of the support that residents have heaped upon them.

We know that small-scale, locally owned businesses create communities that are more prosperous, connected, and generally better off across a wide range of factors. When we buy from independent, locally owned businesses, rather than national chains, a significantly greater portion of our money is then cycled back through our local economy—to make purchases from our friends' businesses, to aid our neighbors in need, and to support our local farms—ultimately strengthening the base of our whole community. That's why we added a Shop Snohomish Holiday Directory as part of this edition of the Fall Quarterly. I hope you will find it useful when choosing between a purchase from a large distributor or a local business in town.

Keep your money where your heart lives, support and economy of friends and neighbors, and build a community that thrives by thinking local first.

Service is Snohomish's Rescue Plan of 2021

If it were possible within a fallen world to have a truly perfect “free market”, it would be a tangible redemption of sorts where everyone, no matter how imperfect, would be fully and equally free to serve one another. Of course differing abilities and free-choices made by each individual would render a variety of financial outcomes, but the primary focus would be on our service to one another—not the money itself, which would be of value only for the sake of reconciling accounts. Such a free market could be most efficient for the production of nearly all things good because service would be over money. Imagine that!

Government, on the other hand, would then be the necessary Yin to that Yang. If it were possible in a fallen world to have a truly perfect government, it would deliver the precise amount of oversight necessary to protect everyone's identical rights, and perhaps little more. This would come at a small cost

to the production of service to one another, but it would be to facilitate an even playing ground for the sake of production, not to be the production, itself. Nonprofits and churches would then be the primary facilitators of social service.

I would suggest that the more our focus is on service to one another, the closer to a free market we get. The more we focus on money, the farther away from one another we get. To paraphrase Economics

Professor Milton Friedman, there is no such thing as free lunch money. Things that appear to be free will always have a hidden or implied cost to somebody. Perhaps, in recent years, Washington D.C. has been focusing more on the money than on our freedom to serve each other. The U.S. Government is



in debt. When it “pays” people “free money” it is either borrowed and then paid back in taxes by our grandchildren, or it is “printed on new dollar bills” and paid back by those who are trying to live on their life savings - namely our retired generation - through the cost of inflated prices.

The Federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 is going to cost SOMEBODY 1.9 trillion dollars. If those dollars were seconds, that would be equal to 60,207 years' worth.

This message is particularly intended to be one of gratitude to our local business owners and their hard-working employees. You are a bearing of things good, here in Snohomish - the stuff of service to others - and the sales tax you generate is our largest source of funding collected for City Hall to protect this community, as to public safety -with Police, as to movement -with our streets, as to wellness -with our parks, and as to facilitating safe shelter -with planning and permitting.

We Can Work Together

I am writing this in early October. The General Election is weeks away, so I don't yet know if I will be serving Snohomish in an elected role next year. I do know that I will continue to serve this amazing community however I can.



With this article, I've come full circle as a Councilmember. Within days of being elected in 2017, my first duty was to write an article for the *Quarterly*. I tried to write about what I felt was the most pressing issue facing Snohomish. I wrote about the division we had experienced as a community during the contentious election period that had just ended. I wrote that we needed to come together and build bridges of understanding that would strengthen our communal bonds. But since then the gulf has only widened between neighbors and between discourse and reality. We seem further divided even as we recognize the danger in that.

I have noticed that our recent period of isolation has made people hungry for connection. But some people now seem to want to connect only with others like themselves and react to anyone different with distrust and fear. Some go farther and actively try to impugn the motives and character of people they see as different, seemingly without concern for truth or accuracy. This erodes the communication necessary for reaching understanding, which leads to further distrust. This is harmful to our community well-being. We need to break this feedback loop because it leads to an inability to work collaboratively toward common goals, to anger and, in the extreme, to violence. We each need to examine the part we play in that cycle.

What are we saying on social media and in person? Are we spreading rumors, misinformation, and hate? Can we instead focus on the positive and on facts and resist the pull toward the more base instincts of defensiveness and

an "us vs. them" mentality? Can we look for how we can be enriched by what we can learn from people that are not the same as us?

I believe we each have a duty to see the good in each other, accept our differences, and find ways to work

The City Hall Virtual Counter is Open

With the launch of the Planning Department’s new “Virtual Counter”, getting the information for your building or land use project just got much easier.

With a Virtual Counter appointment, you can get all the information you need and interact in real-time with City staff from the comfort of your home or office. Using screen-sharing technology, Virtual Counter appointments provide interaction with City staff from departments selected by you.

The Virtual Counter is intended for preliminary, conceptual questions, just as you would ask in person at the City Hall public counter. It should not be confused with a Pre-Application, which is for people who have their project a bit more hammered out and are

looking for feedback from staff about code compliance before they submit an application. If you’re looking at purchasing a property in town and want to know more about it or what you can do with it, a virtual counter appointment is for you. If you’re thinking about finally adding that extra room, or that mother-in-law apartment, deck, or other improvement to your existing property, schedule a virtual counter appointment to find out what permits you’ll need or whether there are any restrictions to be aware of before you get too far into

designing your project.

If you don’t think a virtual meeting is for you, you can still call or email City staff directly to get the information you need or to schedule an in-person appointment.

To initiate a Virtual Counter appointment all you have to do is fill out a simple online form where you describe your project or issue, list the questions you have, tell us who you need to speak with, and choose your preferred dates/times to meet. You’ll hear back from a staff member with an appointment time and a link to access the virtual meeting (using Zoom).

These appointments are intended for those wanting an interactive experience with staff, including sharing screens. A device with an internet connection and microphone is necessary.

VIRTUAL COUNTER REQUEST
Visit the Virtual Counter webpage and click to fill out the online form. Tell us a little bit about your project or the questions you have, which City departments you’d like to speak with, and when you’re available.

BE ON TIME
Be ready for your meeting with staff on the scheduled day and time. Click the meeting link to begin the meeting. Have your questions prepared, and any conceptual plans or other items you would like to share loaded and ready. Let us know in advance if you need to cancel or reschedule your appointment.

SHARE YOUR SCREEN
If you want to show staff conceptual drawings, site plans, aerial images, or site photos, have them ready before the meeting starts. You will be able to share your screen to help the discussion and get more specific feedback.

STAFF ASSISTANCE
As always, City staff is available to answer your questions via phone or email, or you can contact us to schedule an appointment in person.



QUESTIONS FOR CITY STAFF
The Virtual Counter Appointment is a great way to interact with City staff:

- Questions about your property
- Feasibility/due diligence
- Potential construction/development projects
- Permit questions
- Follow-up questions about Pre-Application comments

APPOINTMENT CONFIRMATION
A staff member will contact you with confirmation of your scheduled appointment, including a hyperlink to access the meeting on the scheduled day.

ASK QUESTIONS & GET ANSWERS
Staff representing the departments you requested will be at the meeting and will be ready to answer your questions. You may also request contact information to follow up later.

PRE-APPLICATION
A Pre-Application is a free service in which you submit details about a conceptual project and receive written comments back from staff. If your potential project is a little further along, or your questions are more related to meeting applicable codes, you may want to do a Pre-Application instead.

Public Hearing Set for Midtown District Development Regulations

The Planning Commission is set to hold a public hearing on proposed regulations to create a new Midtown District zone with special design standards and development regulations.



Over the past several months, the Planning Commission has held workshops to translate the Midtown Task

Force's recommendations into code language. That work is done and now it's the community's turn to weigh in at a public hearing to be held Jan. 5, 2022.

The draft design standards would be the most detailed and proactive in the City. They are based on a model code developed for the City by MAKERS Architecture & Urban Design. The primary goal of the new standards is to ensure new development and redevelopment will reflect the "Snohomish Character". Part of that goal is to create a pedestrian- and bicycle-friendly environment in Midtown (the Avenue D commercial corridor from Sixth Street to SR9), with more landscaping and useable open space.

The proposed development regulations are intended to encourage mixed-use and multi-family development in Midtown. While the Task Force recommended allowing more intense development in Midtown providing for increased densities and building heights

(up to 5 stories in some areas), the draft proposal being put forth by the Planning Commission sets a maximum building height of 35 feet for almost all of the Midtown District. The Planning Commission proposal does include removing maximum density limits for the area; instead relying on parking requirements and building height to control density.

If you would like to be notified via email of all steps in the Midtown planning process or if



you want to offer written comments for the Planning Commission to consider at their public hearing, email Planning Director Glen Pickus at pickus@snohomishwa.gov. Comments can also be mailed to his attention at Snohomish City Hall, P.O. Box 1589, Snohomish, WA 98291.

After the Planning Commission public hearing, the City Council will consider the Planning Commission and Task Force recommendations at their own public hearing and then adopt ordinances amending the Land Use Development Code to create the new Midtown District. The City Council is tentatively scheduled to take this up in February or March 2022.

MAKING SENSE OF INVESTING

City of Snohomish and the American Recovery Plan

The American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA) was signed into law March 2021 and will provide \$1.9 trillion in federal financial assistance to individuals, businesses, and local governments across the nation. Under the Plan, U.S. cities and towns will receive \$65.1 billion, with the City of Snohomish receiving \$2,834,468 in two equal distributions. The first distribution of \$1,417,234 was received in June 2021, and the second distribution of \$1,417,234 coming approximately 12 months later.

Cities can use ARPA funds to:

- Support public health expenditures
- Address the negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency
- Replace lost public sector revenue
- Provide premium pay for essential workers, and;
- Invest in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure.

The Snohomish City Council discussed the ARPA funds in detail, requesting citizen input throughout the last quarter, and provided direction to staff on the allocation of the ARPA funds. On October 5, 2021, the Snohomish City Council approved action to allocate the City's portion of ARPA funds to the following areas:


Utility Billing and Rent Assistance

One-time grants to households earning no more than 40% of Snohomish Median Income. Up to 50 families may receive grants of up to \$1,000 each in 2021, up to 40 families may receive up to \$1,000 each in 2022, and up to 30 families may receive up to \$1,000 each in 2023.

Non-Profit Organization Support

Grants up to \$20,000 and totaling no more than \$300,000 will be offered to assist nonprofit organizations that have suffered substantial financial losses due to prolonged closures, cut-backs, and loss of business.

Direct Business Support and Economic Development Business Training Programs

Up to \$720,000 over the course of three years to provide small business support. Small businesses often have competing demands on their time as they operate their respective businesses. These funds will be directed to the local business community that implement Retail Strategies or other City contracted consultant recommendations. This can include enhanced local and regional advertising, support of events, signage and programs designed to promote small business and the City.


Snohomish Rescue Plan Public Safety Program

1. Up to \$280,000 in installments of \$140,000 per year in 2021 and 2022 for Police Support.
2. Up to \$50,000 shall be allocated to conduct public outreach with water utility customers and assess lead content in the City water distribution system.

Snohomish Rescue Plan City Infrastructure

1. Up to \$535,000 from the ARPA funds shall be allocated to reimburse City capital expenditures through 2026 associated with infrastructure projects, such as a First Street and Historic Downtown Utility and Street Master Plan. Elements include water, sewer, sidewalks, trees, garbage, outdoor seating, and parking.
2. Water and Sewer Line Replacement and Broadband Analysis. Complete a detailed analysis of broadband availability to identify underserved areas within the City.

Small Business Support with Retail Strategies

COVID-19 has shifted consumer behavior and left locally owned business owners wondering how to respond and adapt. The City is utilizing American Rescue Plan funding for these services.

Retail Strategies' Small Business Support platform takes a multi-pronged approach to assisting local business owners with understanding current market conditions and uncovering and leveraging opportunities that this consumer shift presents. Providing business coaching and quarterly trainings for small businesses in the community shows the level of support and dedication the City of Snohomish has to local entrepreneurs.

This partnership includes live training webinars and one-on-one coaching for business owners most in need of technical assistance. Training sessions focus on business modernization, omnichannel retailing, and opportunities for business growth and development. The Retail Strategies program will not only train owners to modernize their businesses, but they will customize the trainings to the unique attributes of the Snohomish business community.

Here in Snohomish and across the globe, the small business community plays a vital role for every city in America, from job creation to creating and sustaining the vibe within a city. The team of experts at Retail Strategies will lead Snohomish small business owners through a series of hands-on trainings and provide tools to thrive in the current environment we are in.



City Receives New Accreditation Thanks to Dedicated Staff Member

Congratulations to Karen Allen, Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator/Laboratory Technician on receiving the Environmental Laboratory Certificate of Accreditation for Peracetic Acid by SM 4500-PAA in Non-potable water. This accreditation from the Washington State Department of Ecology was awarded thanks to Karen's dedication, and is the first in Washington State.

The City is entrusted with the quality of water that our wastewater plant effluents into the Snohomish River and must adhere to strict guidelines to ensure the health and safety of our users. Environmental laboratories in Washington must adhere to numerous proficiency standards to seek and maintain accreditation. Accreditation demonstrates that a lab is able to perform the analytical methods for which they are accredited.

In addition to testing for alkalinity, solids, biochemical oxygen demand and ammonia (to name a few) this new accreditation in peracetic acid means the City doesn't have to pay an outside lab for testing, saving Snohomish utility rate payers external lab fees.

The Wastewater Treatment Plant team is always looking at new and innovative approaches to lowering costs while improving the quality of the effluent leaving the plant. Great Job, Karen!


It is a fortunate gardener who has a garden gate, swinging open into a private haven and locking out the workaday world with the satisfying click of a heavy latch.






